



Preparing for a Visit

Book a Bonus Event:

Kristi would love to have a special lunch and discuss writing with students She's also available for in-school book signings or interviews. Bonus events do not count as formal presentations, and can be scheduled when time allows during a regular school visit.

Full Day Fee: \$400 plus travel expenses (to save on travel, contact Kristi to see if she is already coming to a school near you!)

If you can't fund a full-day fee, consider splitting the cost with another area school.

(Please remember, a school visit takes away two or three days of writing time.)
